Visitor Promotion Committee Meeting Minutes Thursday December, 17, 2020 at 8:06 a.m.

- 1. Review November 2020 VPC meeting minutes motion to place on file: Willey second: Mueller
- Swanson asked for an addition of attendance of all committee members minus Todd. All AYE
- 2. Financials November 2020 motion to place on file: Swanson second: Willey
 - 1. Disbursements Mellema said we still have rent showing up on disbursements twice, but he is only getting one check a month. Willey asked how we fix this, Mueller said we need to stop making it a payable and it will correct our problem in Quickbooks. Swanson asked if this is why the balance sheet is off, and Mueller said yes. Mellema said next month we will start to see income and payments for the Flyway crane migration grant. We have a spreadsheet of expenses, but the money from each partner has to run through our office. Half of the money is coming from the State. The two expenses we have now are from Maly Marketing and they are handling our social media. Swanson asked, beyond the spreadsheet, that there is a summary so someone can look back and the board doesn't have to question why we spent \$30,000. Mueller asked if there was a real expense to us. Mellema said there will be one expense as we have to pay for our partner expense in the grant and we can't pay ourselves. Mueller wants to make a line for the grant in Quickbooks so it all goes and comes out of that one line item and can be easily tracked. We will also have to do the same thing if our grant from the GGI is approved.
 - 2. Income & Expense Report -
 - 3. Profit & Loss Budget Performance Mellema said on the income side we are hitting our yearly goals. If you look compared to last year, our income is down but our budget was adjusted accordingly. We hope to see events come spring. Mellema said P&L shows the budget a little bit better. They were late on pulling out the Stuhr \$10,000. Our bottom line is the same but they just didn't pull the money out in July/August like a normal year. Swanson asked why it didn't happen, Mellema doesn't know why they were late. He was going over numbers with the County and they noticed they were different. So Mellema will add it to his calendar to possibly talk to them. Swanson asked if we can talk to Pam and see if we can add this money to our marketing budget and Mellema said he has talked to Stuhr already and they are ok with

that.

- 4. Balance Sheet Mellema said we already discussed the negatives on there. We have money when the calendar flips. If we forget to make a transfer it automatically withdrawals, so we never actually have a negative balance in the bank account. We want to maintain our reserve at \$100,000 and we are currently well above that. But we might have to tap into it eventually depending on how the winter goes.
- 5. Lodging Tax Report Mellema does hope that the numbers for this spring and summer will be better. Crane migration is limited on booking tours but we are still encouraging taking tours on your own. Private tours are still booking. Sporting events are still moving forward. Large events are starting with filling out the form with the CDC, because if it doesn't get approved there's no point of planning. SkillsUSA will turn into a one day skills event if it happens. 4-H Shooting will make their decision by April 1. The Home Show was displaced because of the livestock show and they have moved to the last weekend in March. Heartland Hoops is still up in the air. Cheer & Dance is approved, most likely to be a four day event with hopefully the same number of participants. Attendance will most likely kill that event. As for rodeo, Dianne has a call scheduled, that may move back to April. AKC dog show is still on board and shouldn't have a problem.

McCloud asked if the mask mandate is in place until February 23. Mueller asked if restrictions are uplifted if things will help, but Willey said the problem is the 6ft rule. DeLaet asked how soon we could get STR report back, it's a matter of calling and getting it back and paying for the yearly subscription. Swanson asked how we anticipate the casino impacting us long term. We hope to have a casino up in 18-24 months. McCloud said Linicoln's plan is to have parking ramps, 200 room hotels, it will be a destination type of casino. We also have the opportunity with all the other buildings that we have on Fonner Park. McCloud said Lincoln plans to have the whole casino done and ready to go before they open the doors. A casino will be an important game changer in the tourism world.

3. Action/Discussion

GICVB officer team - Proposed slate - Proposed from the committee was to move Mueller to new Chair, DeLaete to former chair, Willey as vice chair, and Swanson as treasure. Motion to approve the slate: McCloud second: McCoy All AYE

Form committee to review bylaws - attached existing bylaws - Mellema sent a copy of existing bylaws. We are currently set up with an executive committee and a VPC. What needs to happen is a committee needs to form to update the document, Swanson had previously asked if we can do zoom which would need to be clarified in the bylaws for example. If we make a change we have to let it sit for a month and then vote on it.

Swanson motioned the executive committee to review the bylaws. Swanson said there isn't anything in the bylaws that says we can't do that. Willey suggested once the pandemic is gone we get rid of the hybrid option. The key is if you're not present you are not allowed to vote, you become an observer. McCloud suggested looking at the bylaws if we can restrict people from attending. Swanson said our meetings are public, we can be open to zoom since we open to the public. Mueller suggested an addition to instead of exclusively. Willey suggested everyone reads the bylaws and bring comments as it would benefit everyone. Swanson withdraws his motion about the executive committee. Mellema said it should take half an hour to an hour to review. He will also give the group his recommendations. Swanson said if we are making huge changes we need to go to an attorney. Willey asked for the next meeting to show the group attendance from this last year.

CVB grant request - attached for discussion. - Mellema said the group had questions about multiple grants and he has answers for them now. The CVB's marketing grant was entered for three grants and they have now all been submitted. The CVB grant is to get a unified branding for the city of Grand Island that identifies us as an end destination. The CVB wants to hire an agency to create creative designs that are cohesive for Grand Island. Ultimately the goal is to put more people into hotel rooms. We already mentioned that pleasure tourism is going to be important so we need to correct messaging for such. Willey asked Mellema to explain the \$25,000, which is the social media blitz, travel guide, they may only give us \$10,000 or \$19,000. Fonner and Stuhr are both committing money to this grant and they will be a part of identifying the branding. Grow Grand Island money would go toward the advertising buys. State money has to be 100 miles away but we can put our money wherever we want. We expect the images that come from it to last 3-5 years. Swanson asked if Mellema had looked at some of the past rebranding efforts for the cities. Mellema said this is tourism based and not a rebranding effort of the whole city. Swanson would like background on the past rebranding efforts so we can make sure we are sustainable and what our plan is. Mellema said it is a tourism based message but he hopes it resonates with business and they say 'yes that's who we are.' We have to develop messages that only Grand Island can say, it's all right here is something that any city can say. Swanson suggested visiting with Mike Olsen, as he was a part of the all right here. Hastings recently did a rebranding effort but you're not

aware of it.

Swanson asked to see the bid from these marketing firms. Mellema said we have Firespring, Ideabank, Tally, and an individual person. Willey asked if the bid designates where the money goes, and Mellema said it does. Mueller asked if the new grant information can go out to everyone on the grant review committee so everyone can fully review the grants. Willey said that group needs to decide if we move forward with these grants. Willey asked if we have the rest of the information requested for the grant committee. Swanson wants to know where other funding sources are for the Chamber groups, and Mellema said there is none. Mueller just wants the groups to check the boxes so that we know they are correctly spending the money. Mellema talked to Bill Ogg about giving money to Asarkben. There are sections such as, facilities, hotels, set up, judges fees so it would be a direct underwriting for one or two of these sections. Our Economic Impact will be coming at the beginning of the new year. Swanson asked why the grant went through Gilca and not just Askarben. Mellema said it was easier, but Willey said Askbaren is still wishy washy. Omaha Aksarben is a non profit but the cattle show is just a name currently. GILCA owns Askarben in legal documents. The State Fair is planning to do Aksarben unless there is a reason to restructure it. Mellema suggested having the State Fair right the grant next year instead of GILCA. There was concern of just writing a check for salaries and not just core underpinnings. Swanson said that every year they need to update the AIN/Equine Storage instead of using old grants and including updated invoices. The committee wants them to put in the effort for a new grant instead of just assuming they get the money. Mueller wants more clarity for outside auditors on the grant requests. Willey suggested that in our bylaws we are supposed to only have one grant per entity. Swanson asked who owns the equine storage building. McCloud said GILCA owns all of the stalls inside. Mueller said it sets a precedent for the future. Mueller suggested that GILCA needs to put together their one request for the marketing and the building storage. Swanson asked where we rent horse stalls now, different shows rent differently they're normally \$25-\$35 a night. A show pays Fonner to set up stalls and they collect the stall money. Willey suggested that if we are paying for the equine storage building just keep paying on normal terms. Table action on the grants for the time being.

Contingency plan - Mellema had a spreadsheet with the passwords. Currently he is changing passwords and moving them all to Dashlane, everyone's accounts are accessible under this account. Paul has way more accounts and has all been under Dashlane. We have a nas drive and that goes to the cloud and that's a service that we pay for. All VPC documents are on google drive

and protected from our new password software. All employees and our board chair will have access to the password to get all passwords. Swanson wants a list of day to day things that everyone in the office does so that all bills are paid, taxes, GILCA. Swanson would like a book that all board members have access to. Mellema can create a list of what we need to get done (punch list) and make sure that everything is getting done. Willey wants to know if there's a check and balance for all the passwords. Swanson wants to know if there is a two step or one step process for EFT. Mellema said for a thief to do something here it would take 30 days. Mueller said the transparency and the scope is so small here in the CVB it isn't a problem. McCloud said he believes that it's Mellema's responsibility to take over these things in case he is sick or no longer here. Mellema will create a responsibility list that we get done in a day/month if something does happen. Mueller thinks we should modify an older list so we don't spend too much time.

Heartland Event Center -

4. Reports

GGI - they are holding an annual retreat in January and the grant that was discussed earlier will be discussed then. They are working on signs for the entry to town, 281 and east side of south locust. These are monument style welcome to grand island signs. Mueller asked if there would be a minor grant to help pay for this land lease on South Locust. Swanson suggested a fund to set aside for something like this. Mellema said we do pay for signs on the interstate, so if this committee approved it we could pay the land rental. Once these are done there are two more signs proposed by the airport and by the turn off by jackrabbit.

GILCA - meets this afternoon, Bill Ogg has names to interview for a leader for GILCA and livestock superintendent for the State Fair. They would have a right hand person to help assist. At this point interviews would happen late december beginning of january and that will involve people from GILCA/Fonner and not just The State Fair. Willey has been sitting in on the meetings to help with facility rentals. Swanson wants a financial statement at the end of the fiscal year. Swanson would like Mellema to request a P&L from GILCA as well.
